

This coloring book is designed to be a fun way for children to learn about the Golden State!




- alifornia became the 31st state to join the United States of America on September 9, 1850.
- Imost 14,500 feet above sea level, Mount Whitney is the highest point in California and the continental United States.
- arger than any other bird in North America, the California condor resides in Central Coastal California. It has a wing span of almost 10 feet.
- n 1879, Sacramento was named California's permanent state capital.
- orests occupy almost 34 million acres in California.
- nly in California can you find the highest and the lowest points in the continental United States.
- edwood trees in California are the largest living organisms in the world.
- icknamed the "Golden State," California has a long association with gold, starting with the 1848 gold rush.
- n Sacramento, the California Railroad Museum is the largest of its kind in North America.
- t 282 feet below sea level, Death Valley has the lowest elevation in North America.

They can represent schools, clubs, political groups, religious organizations, or almost any group of people that like the same things.





# SEAL

A seal is a mark or symbol that is stamped onto important legal documents.





Over 3 million people visit Yosemite every year.


Yosemite Falls is the highest waterfall in North America.


### HOLLYWOOD SIGN

The sign was first created in 1923 to advertise housing, not movies.

It read as "HOLLYWOODLAND" until 1949; in 1973, it was named a historical landmark.

Over 4,000 light bulbs lit up the original sign. One person was in charge of replacing the bulbs whenever they burnt out.





# **MISSIONS**

Twenty-one missions were built between 1769-1835, near or along a coastal road called the El Camino Real (The Royal Road).

The first mission was built in San Diego in 1769; it was rebuilt 4 times.

At San Juan Capistrano, swallows return every Spring from their wintering grounds, over 2,000 miles away!


